Edwina Cox gives a sympathetic performance as Woolcot's kindly young wife, Esther. Melissa Bickerton's flame-haired Judy, the most spirited and dearly loved of the seven, exudes an energy which is one of the main forces of the show.

Beckerton's "romantic and daring" character is a perfect vehicle for her impish qualities and wonderfully expressive face.

Judy's brothers and sisters are an endearing lot, especially the tiny Scott Vanderheydon as the Little General, who in a scene at Victoria Barracks, teams up with the tall and talented Gerrard Symonds for a wonderfully comic routine.
